

Competition Guidelines

- (1) Eligible students must be currently enrolled in Grade 9-12
- (2) One entry per student.
- (3) There is no minimum or maximum word-count or length for submissions. Suggested length is between 500 and 2000 words
- (4) Submissions must be the student's own original work.
- (5) Submissions must be typed and double-spaced, and proofread thoroughly.
- (6) All judges decisions are final.
- (7) The competition deadline is **March 1st, 2016.**
